We are now coming to the end of our Music block, and are getting ready to move on to a History block.

During our music block, children have been looking at different aspects of music - For example, Year 6 have been exploring the sounds around the local area. They have then composed their own musical motif using: their voices, body percussion, instruments and even some beat boxing. They have been inspired by a piece of music called 'No Place Like' by Kerry Andrew. Year 2 and 3 started their block by looking at Stone Age music while year 4 and 5 have been using "A Night on the Bare Mountain" by Modest Mussorgsky as inspiration for stories and artwork. Reception and Year 1 used music to make links to traditional tales such as Little Red Riding Hood.



Remembrance Service




